



Drinking Water in Michigan...

- 1.2 million wells in Michigan
- An estimated 45% of all Michigan residents rely on wells for their drinking water
 - Many small and midsized community water supplies utilize wells
 - 25% of the Michigan residents are served by private wells.


Michigan is Home To...

Properly designed, installed, and maintained septic systems protect people and the environment



Failing Septic Systems

- Failing septic systems pose risks to both public and environmental health.
- Pollution of groundwater and drinking water aquifers, lakes, rivers, streams
- 20% of systems in MI estimated to be failing



Program Overview



The Michigan Legislature appropriated 35 million dollars for EGLE's OWMU to develop and implement a loan program to replace failing and near-failing septic systems statewide.




EGLE has contracted with non-profit, green bank Michigan Saves for the Septic Replacement Loan Program (SRLP).



This is a two-tiered financing program with both an income based and market-based loan.

Program Timeline



Governor Gretchen Whitmer signed Public Act 22

EGLE worked with LHD stakeholders to develop Program Minimum Standards

EGLE contracted with Michigan Saves

May 2023

Tier 1 and Tier 2 launched

21 May 2024

Program Minimum Standards

- Residential onsite wastewater systems all designed, evaluated and installed according to local sanitary codes
- EGLE developed, with LHD stakeholders and input, Program Minimum Standards for the SRLP
 - Minimum isolation distances to groundwater
 - Minimum isolation distances to surface water
 - Standardized design criteria
 - Protective of both public and environmental health

General Provisions





Unsecured, personal loan for individuals owning residential dwellings. Sites with a documented failing, near-failing, non-existent septic system, or similarly inadequate system will be eligible for replacement under the SRLP.



Replacement systems must be evaluated, permitted, and installed in accordance with program minimum standards.



General Provisions: Eligibility

The following projects are not eligible for funding through the SRLP:



Authorized Contractors

- Any contractor wishing to participate in the SRLP must register as an Authorized Contractor through Michigan Saves.
- Michigan Saves, is currently recruiting and registering Authorized Contractors to install systems funded by the SRLP.
- 87 Authorized Contractors Statewide



Workflow

- Starts with the homeowner
- Find Authorized Contractor
- LHD issues permit in alignment with Program Minimum Standards based on site conditions
- Contractor issues bid
- Homeowner applies for loan based on bid
- LHD Permit is uploaded by authorized contractor within 5 business days of loan approval, for EGLE QA
- Loan is approved, system is installed in accordance with permit
- After LHD final inspection, Authorized Contractor uploads all required documents, completes and uploads the Certificate of Completion with homeowner
- Contractor is paid, homeowner begins loan repayment

Tier One: Income Qualified Loan

- Requirements:
 - Meet the income criteria, proof of income is required
 - Credit score agnostic underwriting
- Loan structure:
 - Unsecured personal loan, no lien or collateral required
 - Loan amounts of \$1,000-\$30,000
 - Interest rate no higher than 1.00%
 - Loan terms up to ten years
 - Loan reported to credit bureaus



Tier Two: Market Based Loan


- Requirements to be considered for this tier:
 - Homeowners who do not qualify for tier one
- Traditional underwriting criteria apply
- Loan structure:
 - Unsecured personal loan, no lien or collateral required
 - Loan amounts of \$1,000-\$50,000
 - Fixed interest rates that vary by lender
 - Loan terms up to ten years

194 applications received, resulting in over 100 approved loans and 1.6 million dollars in approved funding

48 systems installed, approved and fully funded.
