

- Harris or Trump wins White House
- Either party controls one or both chambers of Congress
- Executive orders / regulations
- Oversight, government accountability
- Limited policy achievements
- Bipartisanship

- Trump wins White House
- Republicans control Senate, House
- Agenda setting
- Executive branch nominations
- Executive action
- Congressional leadership, committees
- Budget reconciliation
- Judicial nominations (federal)

### NOWRA Advocacy Priorities

### •U.S. Dept. of Agriculture Rural Decentralized Water Systems Grants

- FY 2024 \$5 million plus \$1 million (decentralized systems grants)
- FY 2025
  - House: \$4 million
  - Senate: \$5 million

### U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)

- Grants for low/moderate income, decentralized wastewater systems
- Farm Bill reauthorization

# 2024 NOWRA Policy Wins

- EPA, USDA relationship building
- Positioning NOWRA as technical resource
- EPA expands the Closing America's Wastewater Access
  Gap initiative
- EPA Clean Wastersheds Needs Survey includes decentralized wastewater
- Developing Congressional champions
- Strategic planning to position NOWRA for 2025 advocacy

- Desire for environmental (not climate) policy wins
- Budget reconciliation


### **Challenges**

- EPA oversight, accountability
- Noise and clutter
- Tight federal budgets

### Policymaking Timeline

#### LAME DUCK SESSION

- FY 2025 federal appropriations
  - Continuing resolution or omnibus
  - Federal government shut down?
  - USDA grants program
- Extenders (e.g., healthcare, taxes)
- Farm Bill extension / reauthorization
- National Defense Authorization Act
- Hurricane recovery funding



### 2025 AND THE 119TH CONGRESS

- January 3, 2025
  - Elect House Speaker
  - Organizing the new Congress
- January 20, 2025
  - Presidential inauguration
- FY 2026 budget & appropriations cycle
  - President's budget request Spring
  - Congressional proposals Summer
- Farm Bill reauthorization?
